STATEMENT EDUCATIONAL EFFECTIVENESS

GSTM's educational assessment is a continuing process under the guidance and direction of the Strategic Planning and Institutional Assessment Office, and the Dean of Academic Affairs of UCB.

To accomplish this goal, several ongoing and yearly evaluation and assessment strategies have been developed and are constantly revised for effectiveness. These include annual peer and faculty reviews, coupled with alumni exit interview questionnaires, individual course outcome reports, ongoing assessment of course syllabi, and comprehensive examinations (where applicable), all aimed at assessing student's learning outcome, and linked to the specific goals and standards for each GSTM program.

In addition to its commitment to assessing student learning outcome, UCB is engaged in an ongoing assessment of its governance, leadership, personnel, resources, operations and services to assure fulfillment of its mission and the allocation of resources to insure the educational effectiveness of its programs.

GSTM's mission is the academic and spiritual formation of men and women in the theological Catholic tradition by providing reliable pastoral training through graduate programs of academic excellence so that its graduates can perform responsibly ordained or lay ministerial service to the Church and to the wider Puerto Rican, Caribbean, Latin American and U.S. Hispanic societies. This mission is carried out by GSTM as a graduate program of UCB, accredited by The Association of Theological Schools of the United States and Canada (ATS), and affiliated with the Pontifical University of Saint Thomas Aquinas (PUST) in Rome.

- Master of Divinity program provides along with a personal and intellectual understanding of academic theology according to Catholic tradition, training in pastoral skills that will enable the student to exercise responsibly and professionally ministerial leadership as an ordained or a layperson in the Church and society. This program responds to the demands of the Apostolic Constitution *Sapientia Christiana* of Pope Saint John Paul II on the universities and ecclesiastical faculties and the *Ratio Studiorum* of the Friars of the Order of Preachers. Although it complies with the requirements for admission to ordination, this program is not exclusive to candidates to the priesthood. The program also prepares thoroughly students to pursue advanced studies in Theology or Ministry at doctoral level.
- Master of Arts (Biblical Studies) program aims to provide the student with the fundamental capabilities of knowledge and interpretation of the Scriptures of the Judeo-Christian tradition so they can deepen their understanding of biblical text, and will allow them to continue doctoral studies in the area of Biblical Theology or teach biblical studies at secondary and post-secondary level.
- Master of Arts in Pastoral Theology¹ program aims to provide the student with the fundamental skills to respond to the needs of Puerto Rico in training religious and layperson to assume leadership roles in churches and ministry training facilities.

¹ Master of Arts in Pastoral Theology was approved by Accrediting Board of the Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada in June 2019.

In addition, if they choose to apply for the Bacchalaureatous Sacrae Theologiae, they are required to complete 30 additional credits in Philosophy, concurrent with their degree program.

Graduation Rate

The Graduation Rate is calculated as the total number of completers within 200% of normal time of completion divided by the cohort of new student. The regular time to complete a degree in graduate programs is between 2 to 3 years. The Graduate School of Theology and Ministry (CEDOC) in Puerto Rico, Saint Albert The Great at UCB degree programs have different requirements which impacts the number of years it takes for students to complete a degree. For example, students pursuing a Master of Divinity that choose to apply for the Bacchalaureatous Sacrae Theologiae, are required to complete 30 additional credits in Philosophy, concurrent with their degree program. For that reason most of the students takes longer to complete the requirements for their degree program.
